
Categories of Government According to the Number of Rulers: Overview (1-08)

In their writings, Plato and Aristotle described and analyzed the state in terms of autocracy, oligarchy, and democracy—the rule of one, several, or many. Both Plato and Aristotle advocated the type of government that was ruled by an educated elite, that is, an aristocracy; however, throughout the city-states of Greece they observed all forms of government. Still used today, these categories are outlined below.



Democracy

A government in which the people hold the power to rule, either directly or through elected officials, i.e., "rule by the ruled." Sovereignty is in the hands of the people.
